Savannah, Georgia | November 8-11, 2018

The largest urban Historic Landmark District in the United States. Once nicknamed the Venice of the South. Touted as the most beautiful city in North America. If you love history, you'll love Savannah.

Schedule



Thursday, November 8 – Arrival

Arrive at Savannah/Hilton Head International airport and take a cab, Uber or Lyft to the **Perry Lane Hotel** (about a 30-minute ride). Our program will begin at 4:30 p.m. at the hotel in the Easy Street room for hors d'oeuvres and cocktails.

We'll watch our first screening of films and then take a short walk to the **Olde Pink House** for dinner. This Georgia-style mansion was built in 1771 for James Habersham Jr., a prosperous merchant in Savannah. Through its history the house has served as private home, bank, tea-room and headquarters for Union forces during the Civil War occupation of Savannah. Today, the Olde Pink House is home to what *Southern Living* called the “most Savannah-esque restaurant in town.”



Friday, November 9 – Films

We'll begin with breakfast at the hotel and then head to our second screening of films. We'll break for lunch at **Vic's on the River**. Completed in 1859, the building was originally used as a warehouse and later housed Stevens Shipping Company. During the Civil War, General William T. Sherman's subordinate officers used the building's empty offices for housing and planning space. After lunch, we'll return to the hotel for our next screening session.

No alcohol. No slavery. No lawyers. No Catholics. When James Oglethorpe founded Savannah he planned for his city to be built around four squares and these four simple prohibitions. His vision for an idyllic society didn't last long. Banning liquor just made people want it more. That's why we're having cocktails at the **American Prohibition Museum**, then heading over to **Belford's** for dinner.

Completed in 1902 and designed by Hyman Witcover, the architect of Savannah's gold-domed City Hall, the 2-story structure originally belonged to the Savannah Hebrew Congregation. Twenty-one years later, the Congregation sold the building to the Belford family to house its wholesale food company. It is now known throughout the Southeast for its award-winning menu.

Saturday, November 10 – *Films & Discussion*

We'll begin with breakfast at the hotel, then head out for a tour of historic Savannah. Lunch will be at **The Pirates' House**. Established in 1753, the original tavern was a bawdy gathering-place for visiting seamen. The entrance to one of Savannah's underground tunnels is at the Pirates' House. Our guide will make sure we visit the rum cellar, too.

After lunch you'll have some free time to explore Savannah on your own. There's plenty of shopping and museums to keep you busy.

We'll watch our final screening of films in the early evening and then take a short walk to **45 Bistro** in the iconic Marshall House for dinner. Established in 1851, this hotel has had a colorful history spanning 167 years, including roles as a hospital during the Yellow Fever epidemics and a Union hospital during the final months of the Civil War. It was also home to Joel Chandler Harris, author of the famous *Uncle Remus* stories.
